
IN THE MATTER OF the *Pension Benefits Act*, R.S.O. 1990, c. P.8 (the “Act”), in particular sections 69 and 89;

AND IN THE MATTER OF the Registered Pension Plan for Salaried Employees of SFP Canada Ltd., Registration Number 1215425 (the “Plan”).

ORDER

On May 21, 2021, pursuant to section 89 of the Act, and by delegated authority from the Chief Executive Officer of the Financial Services Regulatory Authority of Ontario (the “Chief Executive Officer”), the Director, Relationship Management and Special Pension Services (the “Director”) issued a Notice of Intended Decision to make an order to wind up the Plan effective February 29, 2020 under section 69 of the Act.

The Notice of Intended Decision was delivered to the administrator, The Manufacturers Life Insurance Company and the employer, SFP Canada Ltd. on May 21, 2021. Section 89 of the Act provides that any person on whom a Notice of Intended Decision is served has thirty (30) days after the Notice of Intended Decision is served to request a hearing by the Financial Services Tribunal (the “Tribunal”).

On June 24, 2021, the Registrar of the Tribunal confirmed that the persons on whom the Notice of Intended Decision was served did not request a hearing by the Tribunal in accordance with section 89 of the Act. Therefore, pursuant to section 69 of the Act, the Director makes the following decision.

ORDER

An Order to wind up the Plan is hereby issued effective February 29, 2020 for the reasons set out in the Notice of Intended Decision.
