

New Continuing Education (CE) requirements for 2026 renewal

FSRA has introduced new CE requirements for mortgage agents and brokers. These requirements have two components: Conduct CE and Technical Knowledge/ Professional Development (“Professional CE”).



The deadline to complete **both** the Conduct CE course and Professional CE hours requirements is March 31st, 2026.



You must complete CE for renewals in even years: 2026, 2028, 2030, etc.

If you don't meet the CE requirements on time:

- Your licence will not be renewed.
- You will not be able to work as an agent or broker until you complete all CE requirements and reinstate your licence.
- Your licence renewal application won't meet the minimum requirements and will be reviewed more closely.

New Continuing Education (CE) requirements

There are two components

Conduct CE course

- 5 hours for agents
- 7 hours for brokers

Reporting to FSRA

If you have completed the Conduct CE course, the course provider will inform FSRA directly. You do not need to report course completion to FSRA.



Technical Knowledge / Professional Development CE (Professional CE) hours

- 10 hours for all agents and brokers

These additional hours will help raise professionalism in your sector.

Qualifying course providers

For Professional CE, you choose courses that:

- Must be related to the technical aspects of mortgage brokering.
- May include seminars, webinars and industry conferences.

Reporting to FSRA

You must document your Professional CE hours and FSRA may ask to see your records:

- You must keep your records for the four years leading up to the current renewal cycle. For example, once CE is completed for March 31st, 2026, it must be retained until March 31st, 2030.
- Documentation may include certificates or similar records verifying attendance or successful completion.
- You will need to have the course name, provider, number of hours and date of completion.
