The Financial Services Regulatory Authority of Ontario (FSRA) uses the information you provide in the AIR to help identify, assess and monitor risk in the service provider sector, and to calculate annual regulatory fees.</p> <p>The deadline to file the AIR and pay the fee is March 31, 2026.</p> <p>You can file anytime until March 31, 2026. At a minimum, please review Steps 1 and 2 as soon as possible, as you may be required to update information or have questions that may take several business days to respond.</p> <p>The reporting period is January 1 to December 31, 2025. You must file the AIR even if you did not conduct any business during the reporting period.</p> <p>BEFORE YOU PROCEED</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Only the Principal Representative of the licensed service provider can attest to the information in the AIR.• If the AIR is not filed and the fee is not paid by March 31, 2026, FSRA may immediately suspend or revoke your service provider licence. You may also be subject to an administrative monetary penalty.
