**What documents does the Financial Services Commission of Ontario (FSCO) have on file for pension plans that are registered in another jurisdiction and have Ontario members?**

If a pension plan is registered with another jurisdiction in Canada, but has Ontario members, information about the plan is collected and retained by the jurisdiction where the plan is registered. FSCO does not normally collect or have available information about a plan that is registered in another jurisdiction even if it has Ontario members. The only exception is filings that relate to the Pension Benefits Guarantee Fund assessment certificate, if applicable.

To obtain information about a pension plan, the administrator of the pension plan is the first point of contact, followed by the jurisdiction of registration.
